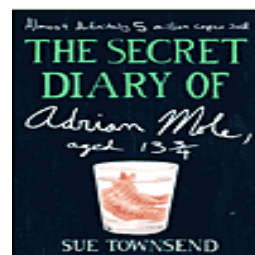

Chinese Ban on Internet Slang in the Classroom

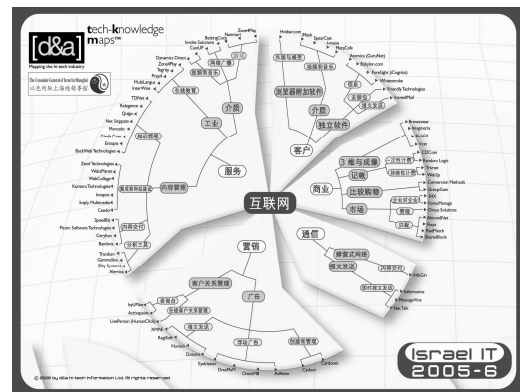
The language police __0__ Shanghai have unveiled a new public enemy number one: slang. From "MM" to "PK" to "konglong", modern ad hoc colloquialisms will be banned from official documents, newspapers __1__ the classroom.

As internet chat and instant messaging increasingly become a part of life for China's computer-literate youth, the use of internet slang has grown and adoption of the terms has permeated __2__ areas of Chinese life.

"On the Web, internet slang is convenient and satisfying, but the mainstream media have a responsibility to guide proper and legal language usage," __3__ Shanghai Morning Post quoted Xia Xiurang, the chair of the culture committee of the Shanghai People's Congress, as saying.

The ever-expanding vocabulary of abbreviated, invented, and adapted terms, __4__ as MM meaning girl and konglong for an unattractive woman and PK for an opponent has rapidly entered the public frame of reference.

A quick glance at a headline from yesterday's China Business News referring to the rivalry between the new heads of Microsoft and __5__ China operations ("Zhang Yaquin goes to Beijing to 'PK' Lee Kai-fu") shows how ingrained the application of these words has become.



Ms Xia said: "Our nation's language needs to develop, but it also needs to be regulated." __6__ she said there is no reason these words could not be used in other settings, she made it clear the use of the words in an official capacity will not be tolerated. She made no reference to __7__ the ban, which is being drafted, would be enforced.

With a population of internet users reaching 103 million in June, China is becoming concerned by the number of young people spending hours of __8__ days on the Web. A limit on the amount of time a minor can spend on it per day was recently introduced.

Pakistani Troops Save Climber From Killer Peak

The Pakistani army 0 (**SAVE**) a stranded climber from an icy ledge on one of the world's most dangerous mountains in a challenging rescue yesterday.

Two Lama helicopters flew at almost 6,700 metres over Nanga Parbat, a Himalayan peak 1 (**KNOW**) as "killer mountain", to rescue Tomaz Humar, a 36-year-old Slovene alpinist.

Humar, who has a reputation for challenging solo climbs, had been trapped on a sheer slope since a snowstorm closed in last Friday.

At dawn yesterday one of the helicopters 2 (**DROP**) a sling to carry him down to safety at the expedition base camp more than 3,000 metres below.

Photographs posted on Humar's website last night showed him collapsing to his knees as his overjoyed support crew gathered around him.

"I was on the phone to the camp when the news came through that they 3 (**ALREADY RESCUE**) him. I cried like a baby," said Nazir Sabir, Pakistan's leading climber, whose company helped organise the trip. A Pakistani army statement described Mr Humar as "hale and hearty".

He had been attempting a new route to the 8,125-metre summit - the world's ninth highest mountain - via a dangerous cliff face.

But a sudden snowstorm, triggering avalanches as often as every 15 minutes, forced him 4 (**ABANDON**) the climb. He survived on a small ledge by burrowing an ice mushroom in the snow to protect his head and upper body.

"The cold was the biggest danger. His sleeping bag was wet and frostbite had started to set in," said Sabir.

Hopes for Humar dimmed after rescue attempts 5 (**PREVENT**) by heavy cloud. When the military helicopters finally reached him at 6am yesterday, the operation also endangered their crew, who were flying 300 metres above the craft's normal ceiling altitude.

When they pulled Humar from the surface he was still attached to an anchor rope. If it hadn't broken, it 6 (**CAN DRAG**) the helicopter into the mountain face.

"To my knowledge I think this is the most unique rescue operation in mountaineering history," said Mr Sabir.

Nanga Parbat, which translates as naked mountain in Urdu, is one of the world's most dangerous ascents.

Humar, who claims to have climbed 1,500 peaks, was attempting the Rupal face, a 4,000-metre rock face considered to be one of mountaineering's greatest challenges. He 7 (**CLIMB**) alpine style, a purist approach that involves a minimum of food and equipment to favour speed and agility.

After recovering at Nanga Parbat base camp Humar is expected to fly to Islamabad today. A biographical note posted on his website claims: "It is believed the gods are fond of him."
