

PRESENT SIMPLE: She **mends** watches here.
PASSIVE: Watches **are mended** here.
POMOŽNI GLAGOL: do

PRESENT CONTINUOUS: They **are mending** my watch.
PASSIVE: My watch **is being mended**.
POM. GLAGOL: am, in, are +ing

PAST SIMPLE: They **mended** my watch yesterday.
PASSIVE: My watch **was mended** yesterday.
POM. GLAGOL: did + 2. obl. gl.

PAST CONTINUOUS: They **were mending** my watch when I arrived.
PASSIVE: My watch **was being mended** when I arrived.
POM. GLAGOL: was, were +ing

PRESENT PERFECT: They **have mended** my watch.
PASSIVE: My watch **has been mended**.
POM. GLAGOL: has, have +3. obl. gl.

PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS: They **has been mending** my watch.
POM. GLAGOL: has, have +ing

PAST PERFECT: They **had mended** my watch by six o'clock.
PASSIVE: My watch **had been mended** by six o'clock.
PO. GLAGOL: had + 3. obl. gl.

PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS: They **had been mending** my watch
POM. GLAGOL: had been +ing

who/that (people)	subject (osebek) - it cannot be omitted
who/whom/that (people)	object (predmet) - it can be omitted
which/that (object, animals)	subject - it cannot be omitted object - it can be omitted
whose (animals, object, people)	possession - it cannot be omitted

Personal/impersonal constructions

think, believe, report, know, expect, understand, consider, say ...

active: People know that she understand Chinese.

personal: She is known to understand Chinese.

impersonal: It is know that she understand Chinese.

Make, help, hear, see

active: Mary helped mother wash the dishes.

Passive: Mother was helped to wash the dishes by Mary.

Hear, watch, see

active: He saw her run out of the house.

passive: She was seen to run out of the house.

active: He saw her running out of the house.

passive: She was seen running out of the house.
