Short Message Service (SMS)

Is a service available on every mobile phone, which permits the sending of short messages between mobile phones.

Electronic mail

Is a store and forward method of composing, sending, storing, and receiving messages over electronic communication systems.

Telephone

Is a telecommunications device which is used to transmit and receive sound across distance.
