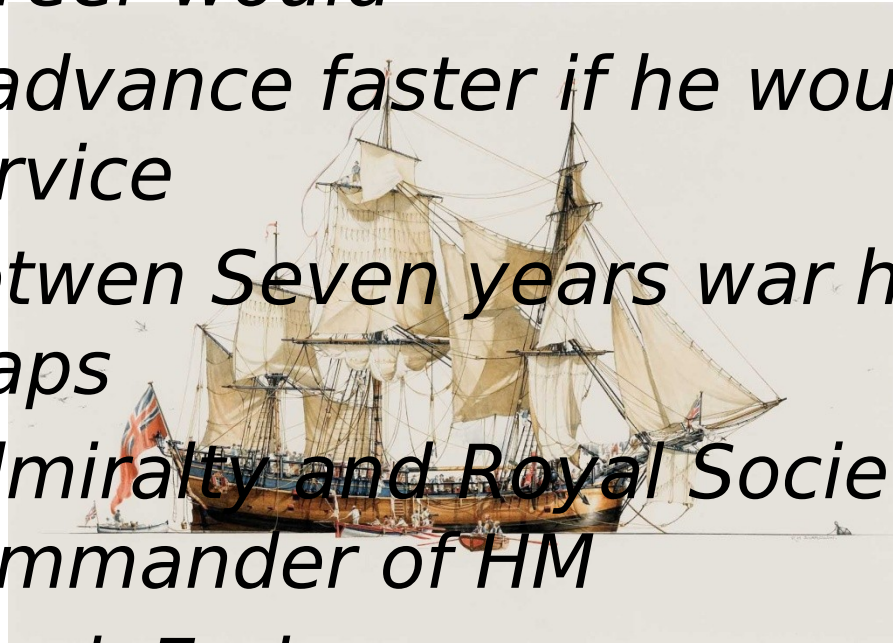
Young Cook

- He was the second of the eight children of James Cook
- In Whitby, he was taken as a Merchant navy apprentice
- After a few years he thought that career would

advance faster if he would join royal service

- Between Seven years war he drew maps

- Admiralty and Royal Society made him a commander of HM

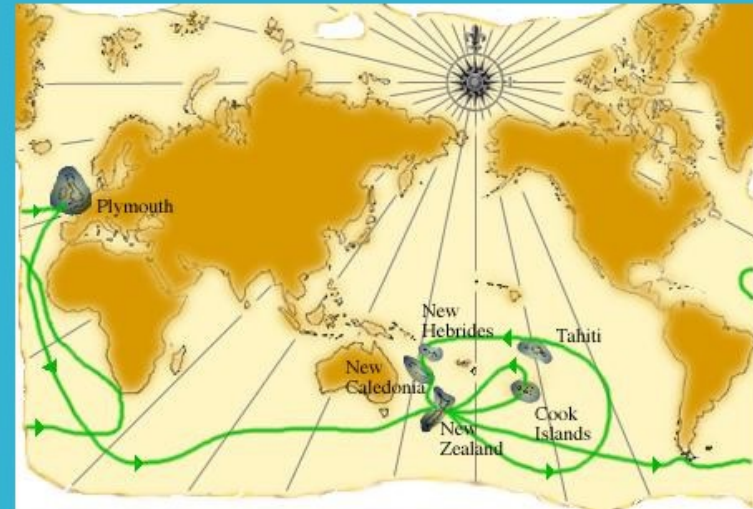

- In 1722 Cook again passed the Pacific search for the hypothetical Terra Australis
- Cook commanded on HMS Resolution and Tobias Furneaux commanded on its companion ship HMS Adventure

discover Northwets passage

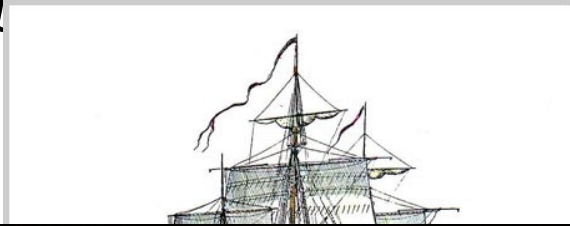
- After he returned Omai, he was the

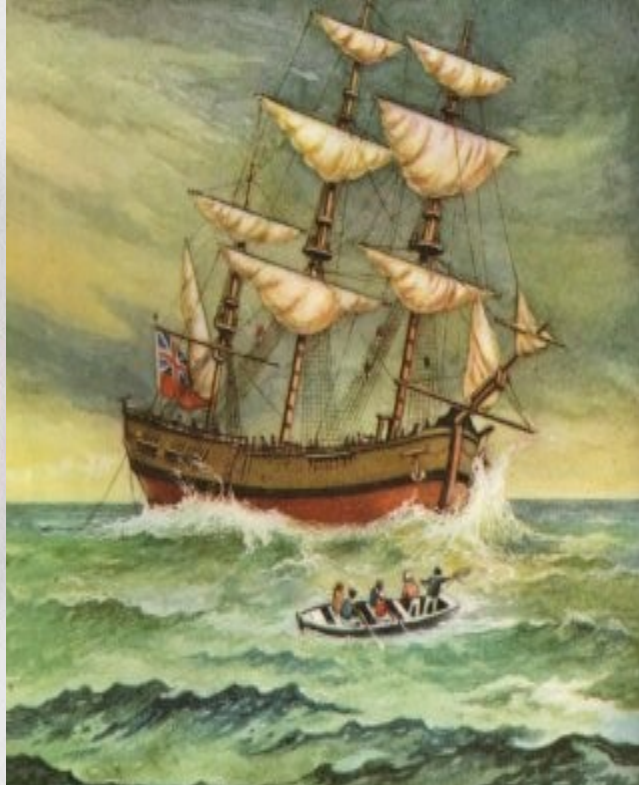
THEN HE WENT TO:
