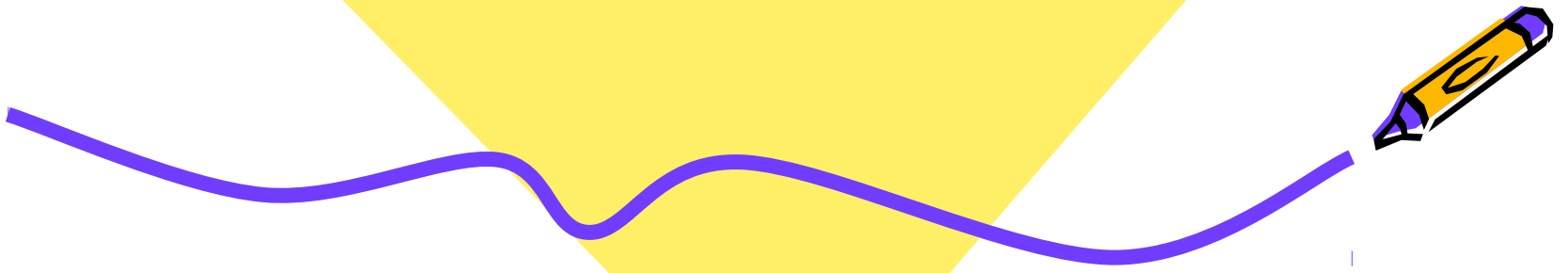


MUST



STRONG OBLIGATION



a) Present → “must”

I **must** clean my room before I go out. = I **have to** clean my room before I go out.

b) Past □ “had to”

I **had to** clean my room before I went out.

c) Future □ “will have to”

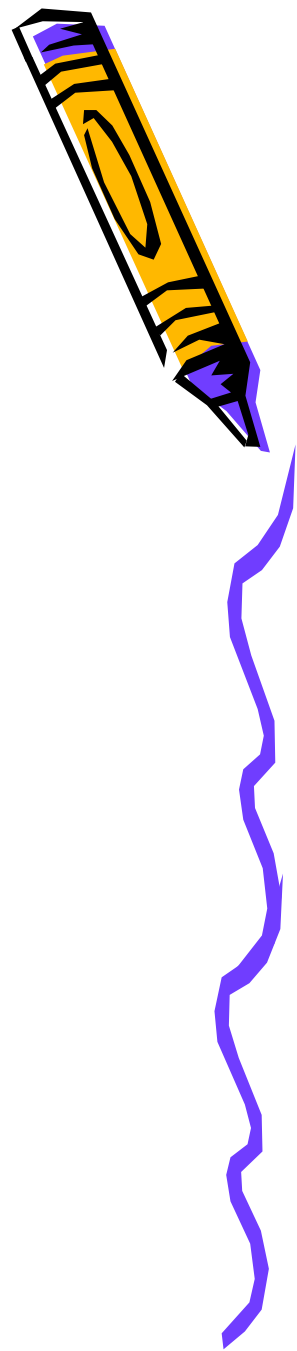
I **will have to** clean my room before going out.



PROHIBITION

Mustn't

You **mustn't** steal other people's things.



TO EXPRESS CERTAINTY



a) Present (must+ inf.)

I am **sure** he is a doctor □ He **must be** a doctor.

b) At the moment of speaking (must+ be+ -ing)

I am **certain** they are having a party. □ They **must be having** a party.

c) Past (must+ have+ past. Part.)

I am **positive** he moved to Celje. □ He **must have moved** to Celje.

d) Duration in the past (must+ have+ been+ -ing)

There is no doubt she was sleeping. □ She **must have been sleeping**.
