## Primož Trubar

<u>Place and date of birth:</u> 8th June 1508, Raščica. <u>Place and date of death:</u> 29th June 1586, Derendingen, Germany.

Primož Trubar was a <u>Slovenian Protestant reformer</u>, the founder and the first member of the Protestant Church of Slovenia. He was the author of the first printed book in Slovenian. He went to school in <u>Rijeka</u> in <u>Croatia</u> and continued his education in <u>Salzburg.</u> From there he went to <u>Trieste</u> to a <u>bishop</u> called <u>Pietro Bonomo</u> to teach him about humanist writers. When he returned to Ljubljana he became a <u>priest</u> but was soon expelled. His first two books were <u>Catechismus and Abecedarium</u> which were written in Slovenian. In the next few years he was the author of around 25 books, all written in Slovenian. Trubar died in <u>Derendingen</u>, <u>Germany</u> (now part of the city of <u>Tübingen</u>), where he is also buried.
