DIFFERENCES BETWEEN AMERICAN AND BRITISH ENGLISH

AMERICAN ENGLISH

American English is in some way totally different than British English. Lets look some differences on the some examples:

1. SPEECH: American English uses more homeless and fast speech than British English. Examples: Sentences based on American and British English:

American English: GOTTA = GOT + TO British English: GOT TO

American English: NOTTA = NOT A British English: NOT A

American English: MOMMA = MUM British English: MOTHER or MUM

2. PRONOUNCIATION:

The differences between pronounciations of American and British English is quite a huge. American English's based on fast pronounciation and words forming. For example: Usual American speaks twice faster than usual British.
