Auxiliary verbs

DO, HAVE, BE!

DO

Do is used for <u>negatives and questions in present</u> (DO, DOES) <u>and past</u> (DID) <u>simple</u>.

Verb is in first form without –ing ending.

HAVE

Have is used in perfect tenses.

In <u>past Perfect</u> tense we use <u>had</u>

In <u>present perfect</u> tense we use <u>have</u> (I, we, you, they) and <u>has</u> (he, she, it).

In future perfect we use will have

Verb is in third form without –ing ending.

BE

Be is used in all continuous tenses.

- *ϕ Past continuous (was, were)*
- $\dot{\omega}$ present continuous (am, are)
- *ϕ* future continuous (will be)
- *ϕ past perfect continuous (had been)*
- *ϕ present perfect continuous (have/has been)*
- $\dot{\omega}$ future perfect continuous (will have been)

Verb have –ing ending.

ACTIVE

Shakespeare wrote Hamlet. (osebek nekaj dela) He writes a book.

PASSIVE

Hamlet was written by Shakespeare. (z osebkom se nekaj dogaja) A book is written.
