- as a noun. Walking is good exercise.
- after certain verbs (admit, anticipate, appreciate, avoid, consider, continue, delay, deny, discuss, enjoy, escape, excuse, fancy, finish, forgive, go + physical activities, imagine, involve, keep = continue, mention, mind, miss, object to, postpone, practise, prevent, quit, recall, recollect, report, resent, resist, risk, save, stand, suggest, tolerate, understand, ...)

They discussed <u>selling</u> the company. Let's go <u>jogging</u>. They prevented her from <u>falling</u> off the cliff. They admitted (to) <u>stealing</u> the car. Sam suggested <u>playing</u> truant. I can't recall <u>meeting</u> her before. Would you mind <u>doing</u> me a favour? (HW- write down sentences helping yourself with an Esh-Esh dictionary)

- after: dislike, enjoy, hate, like, love, prefer to express general preference. She likes <u>painting</u>. (in general)
 - *Note: like + to- inf. = it's a good idea | I like to wash my hair every day.
- * after: I'm busy, it's no use, it's (no) good, it's (not) worth, what's the use of, can't help, there's no point in, can't stand, have difficulty in, in addition to, as well as, have trouble, have a hard/difficult time.
 - He can't stand <u>being</u> treated like a slave. He had difficulty <u>finding</u> his way back It's no use <u>crying</u> over the spilt milk. (proverb) I can't help <u>eating</u> pudding every day. Is Paris worth <u>visiting</u>? What's the use of <u>talking</u> to him, he never listens to anyone.
- * after: spend/waste time, money He spends his freetime digging the garden. He spends all his money playing roulette in the casino.
- * **after prepositions**. He left the shop without <u>paying</u> so he was accused of <u>stealing</u>. We're interested in <u>planting</u> trees. She's keen on <u>going</u> to Kolosej every weekend. Teachers do not approve of students' <u>cutting</u> the lessons.
- * after: look forward to, be/get used to, be/get accustomed to, object to, admit to,...
 I am looking forward to seeing you soon. I simply can't get used to studying at night.
 I strongly object to your lying/ not telling the truth.
- * after: hear, listen, notice, see, watch to express an incomplete action, an action in progress or a long action. I saw Tim doing his HW.

BUT: hear, listen, see, watch + infinitive without »to« express a complete action, sth. that one saw from beginning to end. I saw Tim do his HW.
