THE PASSIVE (trpnik)

John mends a car. (active)

A car is mended by John. (passive)

PRESENT SIMPLE:

TO BE + PAST PARTICIPLE John mends a car.

<u>Cars are mended by John</u>.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS:

TO BE + BEEING + PART PARTICIPLE
John is mending a car.
A car is beeing mended by John.

John is mending cars. Cars are beeing mended by John.

THE AGENT IS LEFT OUT:

1.) When is it unknown
My flat was burgled last night.

2.) When it is not important This bridge <u>was built</u> in 1886
