

<p>PRESENT SIMPLE: am/is/are + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: Mr. Green locks the office every evening. The office is locked every evening by Mr. Green. (Predmet (the office) postavimo na prvo mesto, na koncu stavka dodamo osebo (Mr. Green), če je pomembna.)</p>	<p>PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE: Have/has + been + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: Bill has invited us to the party. We have been invited to the party by Bill.</p>
<p>PRESENT CONTINUOUS: am/is/are + being + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: They are painting the house at the moment. The house is being painted at the moment.</p>	<p>PAST PERFECT SIMPLE: Had + been + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: I thought that somebody had told you the news. I thought that you had been told the news.</p>
<p>PAST SIMPLE: was/were + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: Somebody stole my car yesterday. My car was stolen yesterday</p>	<p>FUTURE SIMPLE: Will + be + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: They will open a new motorway next month. A new motorway will be opened next month.</p>
<p>PAST CONTINUOUS: was/were + being + (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: They were repairing the bridge last week. The bridge was being repaired last week.</p>	<p>»GOING TO« FUTURE: Am/is/are + going to + be + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)</p> <p>Example: They are going to interview Robert on Monday. Robert is going to be interviewed on Monday.</p>

BE + past participle (3. oblika gl. oz. končnica -ed)

We use this form after modal verbs: must, can, could, may, might, should,...

Example:

We **can't do** the job.

The **job can't be done.**
